One of the major distinctive characteristics of the African Studies and Research Forum (ASRF) is the linking of knowledge production and socioeconomic development in Africa. That is, while the ASRF has, and continues to be in the forefront of the production of knowledge on the myriad issues facing the African Continent and its constituent states, it has been equally involved in making practical contributions to socio-economic development, both at the organizational and individual levels.

At the organizational level for example, in 2001, the ASRF established a water project for Liberian refugees residing in the Buduburam Refugee Camp in Ghana. The project served as the major source for providing safe and clean drinking water to hundreds of refugees. Similarly, individual members of the ASRF as scholar-activists have, and continue to be, involved in sundry development projects in Africa. For example, during the heyday of the Ebola virus crisis in the Mano River Basin of West Africa, Sister Peyi Soyinka-Airewele was involved in the preparation and distribution of Ebola awareness and prevention kits.

In continuation of its legacy, the ASRF is poised to launch an "Educational Materials Campaign" for an elementary school in Nigeria. The project was developed by the ASRF's Standing Committee on Projects, and is intended to provide notebooks, pens, pencils, and other educational materials for the students in the selected school. As our Standing Committee on Projects launches this noteworthy project on behalf of the ASRF, I would like to request that we contribute generously!

Let us remember that every well implemented development project, irrespective of its scope, makes an impact on the lives of individuals. In this case, the ASRF is calling on all of us to contribute to this worthwhile project that will impact the lives of our children, thereby contributing to the development of our dear continent's future human resource pool!





The African Studies and Research Forum (ASRF) was founded on October 5, 1996, in Montgomery, Alabama, USA. The organization is an academic association, whose primary purpose is to contribute to the production of knowledge that will help empower Africans so they can build democratic and prosperous societies based on pluralism, respect for diversity, and peaceful co-existence.

The association is governed by its Charter, which stipulates its organizational structure as follow: The General Assembly (comprising all members), the Executive Committee (consisting of the elected officers and chairs of the various standing committees), and the Standing Committees. In addition, there are special committees on "The Best Book Award," and "The Best Graduate Student Paper Award" (presented at the annual conference of the association).

The organization holds an annual conference during which Africanist scholars and practitioners present papers and participate in roundtables on various issues of importance to Africa. In addition, the organization holds research conferences that focus on pressing issues facing (each research conferences focuses on a single issue) Africa. Further, the organization has "The African Policy Dialogue Series" that serve as a forum in which Africanists based in Africa and in the diaspora can dialogue with policy-makers in Africa about various public policy issues.

The association has various important publications: The ASRF Book Series (managed by the Research and Publications Committee), The ASRF Monograph Series (managed by the Research and Publications Committee), *Journal of African Studies and Research* (managed by the editor, associate editor and editorial board), and the ASRF News newsletter (managed by the Public Affairs Committee).

Cognizant of the critical linkage between theory and practice, the ASRF has, and continues to be actively involved as a contributor to development on the African Continent. For example, in 2002, the organization undertook "The Water Project" for Liberian refugees residing in the Buduburam Refugee Camp in Ghana. The organization is planning to undertake other development projects on the African Continent.
